

## Tipton St John Sports Premium Grant 2020/21

Funding Allocated £16,800

### Year Aims: 2020/2021

- Increasing the awareness of the importance of active healthy lifestyles and mental well-being in the current school year. Taking into account the unusual circumstances and extra vigilance required with regard to lifestyle and well-being.
- Continuing the development of staff subject knowledge through membership of the learning community sports partnership.
- Development of pedagogy through links to “Be The Best You Can Be!”
- Monitoring of and reviewing long and medium term planning through building and maintaining resources.
- When restrictions are lifted to continue to establish links with local clubs and coaches, promoting extra-curricular activities and providing enriching opportunities for children who are AG & T
- Introduce and oversee a more robust system of recording our swimming provisions, making sure we are aware of and have recorded those older children who do not currently meet the government recommendations.
- Supporting the Play Leaders and Sports’ Council with specific roles and responsibilities and encouraging a safe, happy and active play environment.
- Investigate and take advantage of offers, competitions and initiatives to secure additional funding, opportunities and equipment for the school. New school sports kit etc.

### also continue to buy into existing School Sport Partnership, which will:

- Provide specialist PE teachers and qualified coaches to work alongside teachers in lessons to increase subject knowledge and confidence within Phys ed.
- Ensure our pupils have regular and sustained access to competition and increase pupil’s participation in national school games competitions. Albeit on our own site during the present climate.
- Provide regular sports tournaments, festivals and competitions for pupil’s of all ages. For 20-21 this will necessitate it being delivered on our own site with Kings personnel in attendance.
- Provide places for pupil’s in after school sports clubs and residential/ outdoor activity centres when available during the coming year.
- Employ a coach to provide a half term, weekly after school instruction within hockey , volleyball, tag rugby, cricket , athletics and Football from the Arsenal academy.
- Forge strong links with PE teacher in local secondary to help Primary staff improve PE and sport provision. Thus ensuring smooth transition.
- Continue with established initiatives such as KS2 sport leaders training

### 2019-2020 How did we do?

- Continue to support a School Sports Council which centres upon the promotion of maintaining a healthy lifestyle through adopting daily, sustainable exercise. (Close liaison with PSHE, Science and Design Tech) ***On going – partly successful but lockdown prevented full benefit***
- Monitor both Key stages and EY to ensure a developed teaching pedagogy which ensures high quality teaching and learning of physical education, with a focus on SEND pupils. ***CPD given by School partnership leader over a 6 week period to both key stages, summer CPD was prevented due to lockdown.***
- Employ high quality coaches to work with teachers and T/A’s alike to promote and maintain high standards of PE teaching. In addition, to provide and model new ideas, concepts and methods during lessons and develop ‘Good Practice’. ***On going - see above***
- Provide provision for both ‘Hi 5’ and ‘Fun Fit’ to be delivered by a member of trained staff (MP) to targeted children on a weekly basis. ***Completed.***

- Provide provision to ensure SEND children are receiving the best support possible during Phys. Ed. across both KS. **Completed.**
- Due to location - provide transport to assist whole class groups to attend tournaments festivals and competitions.
- Help subsidise extra, additional sporting activities such as outdoor and adventurous. **Premier Education provide an after school club for 20 children (23% of the total school population) including ‘street surfing’ and ‘arrow tag’.**
- Establish and sustain partnerships with local community sports clubs. **On going.**
- Provide opportunities for pupils who are gifted and talented as they arise. For example expert coaching or sport school courses.
- Replace and update worn sports equipment. Eg, (Air balls, Soft Tag Rugby balls, Stopwatches and Play leader Eqpt) – **Completed – new updating of other eqpt reqd.**
- To organise cover in order for the subject leader to Pursue achievement of the Platinum active mark. To provide up to date details for the school website – **Platinum award achieved.**
- To Update the Sports Premium Plan and to have a day a term to monitor activities, with a focus upon girls tactical thinking skills.

base line was produced in 2018-19 at all levels to monitor both ability and progress. Although a much-shortened academic year the overall picture appeared to be very healthy. However, there will always be room for improvement especially with those SEND children who are working towards an expected standard and those who are struggling to be included in sessions. This was addressed with both 'Fun Fit' and 'Hi 5' sessions and closer TA one to one within PE/Games and Fizz Wizz, however, the lock down may have produced a backward step. Staff in KS1 have received CPD in a range of multi-skills activities plus an increased involvement from Alex Clements, our specialised coach. KS2 have participated in many inter school tournaments and also received CPD in Handball.

The Platinum mark was awarded to the school for the end of the year 19/20 showing high profile, high achieving Phys. Ed. and Daily Physical Activity. (This is the first award within East Devon. We are constantly looking to adapt to the ever-changing requirements of the children with the Sports premium plan regularly amended. Monitoring by Co-Ordinator has confirmed the value of support staffing during PE for SEND. Children have been able to participate fully inclusive with the aid of a small group situation. All sport transportation that took place pre-lockdown had been subsidised which has ensured both key stages are given the opportunity to compete and we are not overloading the parents with the cost of these crucial trips out.

Swimming is now being monitored with children in lower key stage two receiving, over a two-year period, sessions at the local pool. Year 5 / 6 non-swimmers will be addressed to achieve the minimum ability to swim 25 metres. The play leaders were given three episodes of high quality training to enable them to lead at school in high quality competition during lunch breaks. This year they have been instrumental in delivering fun competitive sport to a very high level. They report back that having a designated adult supervising and answering questions about organisation has ensured that all children in FPS are up and moving at lunchtime. They have collated a considerable amount of ideas to engage the children and compiled a register of attendees for termly review. The lunch-time supervisors have overseen that a rotation of high quality sports has been delivered and enjoyed by every class. They have developed good behaviour management skills and has ensured the programme has been diverse to attract and enthuse all children, our continued participation has been ensured in this way.

Year 5 and 6 participated within high quality competition between local community schools. Pupils were given the chance to participate within after school clubs held at The Kings and to share that experience with children from the local learning community. Thus ensuring smooth transition between Primary and secondary. A series of after school clubs at The Kings School were offered to children of Tipton. A new after school club was introduced delivering a variety of different activities for children to experience.
